## **Environmental science in your school yard**

Get out of the classroom! Join the 1000s of school scientists taking part in this exciting investigation.

Adopt your own spring bulbs to help Professor Plant to find out how our changing seasons are affecting spring flowers.

Since October 2005, school scientists across Wales have been keeping weather records and noting when their flowers open, as part of this long-term study looking at the effects of temperature on spring bulbs.

## **What is the Edina Trust Bulb Project?**

The Edina Trust has formed a collaboration with the National Museum of Wales (NMW) who have been running their 'Spring Bulbs for Schools' Project since 2005.

This collaboration allowed NMW to expand their project to Edina Trust regions across the UK. In 2013-14 there were 150 schools taking part - 71 from Wales, 21 from Scotland and 58 from England.

Edina Trust schools will be taking part in the NMW project **core project** (the Spring Bulbs for Schools Project).

## **In addition...**

Schools will take part in **an extension project** (the Bulb Project) run by the Edina Trust.

Enter weather, daffodil (in pots) and crocus recordings onto the NMW website
