## Science Grant Scheme

The scheme is going well; so far 17 North Ayrshire primary schools have received a science grant! A total of £8,710 has been distributed.

**Remember**, all local authority primary schools, special schools and stand-alone nurseries in North Ayrshire are eligible to apply for a grant of £550 towards a science project for the next **three school years** (2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15)

### Points to note:

- **No retrospective** applications can be accepted.
- The Trust requires a **detailed** breakdown of costs, a brief description and project date in order to process the application
